

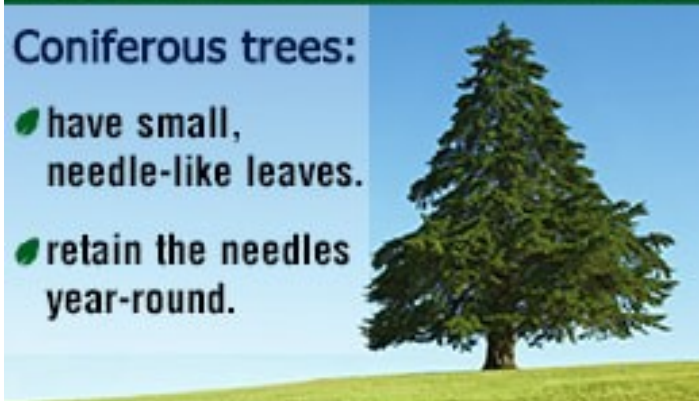
TREES



Deciduous trees:

- have broad, flat leaves.
- drop the leaves seasonally.

A tree is a tall plant that lives for a long time with a trunk, branches and leaves.



Coniferous trees:

- have small, needle-like leaves.
- retain the needles year-round.

There are two types of trees, deciduous and coniferous (evergreen).

A deciduous tree loses its leaves each year.

A coniferous tree keeps its small, green leaves all year round.

In autumn, the leaves on deciduous trees usually change colour and fall off. In winter, deciduous trees usually have no leaves on their branches.

Deciduous trees include oaks, maples and beeches.

Coniferous trees include pine and holly trees.
