# Amphibians

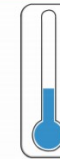
Amphibians are **cold** blooded.

# Reptiles

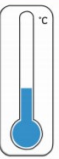
Reptiles are **cold** blooded.

# Fish

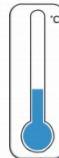
Fish are **cold** blooded.

# Birds

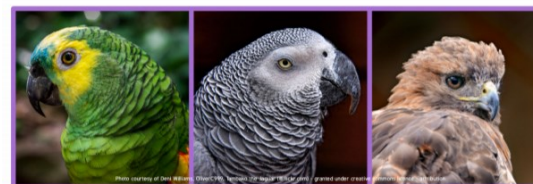
Birds are **warm** blooded.
